



#### New Legal Requirement to Report Breaches

On February 1, 2023, a new requirement to report privacy breaches will be added to the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act*. A privacy breach is an information incident involving personal information. After the implementation date, all serious privacy breaches will have to reported to the affected individual(s) and the Information and Privacy Commissioner. If you become aware of a privacy breach, it is essential to notify our office as soon as possible so that we can advise you about whether the incident needs to be reported.
